Tuesday Morning Bible Study 10:30 to 11:30 AM





Wednesdays, beginning August. 28:




Remember the questionnaire I presented last month using 10 rules for great service? I promised to share the source this month. I drive cars for Rahal Lexus dealership each Friday morning. During a semi-annual training session, these were given us as they relate to customer service. I couldn't help but see their application for us in the Church as we relate to each other, to VISITORS and the community. Here they are again:

- 1. Remember who we serve. (God and others)
- 2. Be sure to listen, repeat, and ask for clarification (Communicating with others)
- 3. Identify and anticipate needs. (of members, visitors, community)
- 4. Make the other person feel important and appreciated.
- 5. Appreciate the power of "yes". (affirmation)
- 6. Give and do more than expected. (the proverbial 110%)
- 7. Get regular feedback. (ask questions and really listen)
- 8. Treat fellow colleagues well. ("Do unto others as you.....")
- 9. Know how to apologize. (be strong, mature & humble enough to say "I'm Sorry")
- 10. Know how to handle objections.

Admit if you messed up. Can you accept the blame for the group even if it wasn't you who messed up. (**Focus on the larger good**)

It's hard to think about Christmas in the summer, but there are 73 nine and ten year olds in the Appalachian area of Kentucky who will not have a single Christmas present to open on Christmas day this year. We have been asked (blessed) by the Outreach Director, Frankie Blackburn at Henderson Settlement, if we could supply gifts this year for these children. Frankie explained that these children are "the neediest of the needy". Their parents cannot afford to buy them a single gift for Christmas. There are 33 girls and 40 boys in this age group this year for a total of 73 children. (In 2010, we were given nine and ten year olds – there were 100 total children). Since this is all they get for Christmas, it is suggested that each child receive two gifts, ranging in value from \$15-20. (NOTE: they do not have to cost \$15-20, just have that value or more. Right now Kohl's has \$28 watches & bracelet sets for \$5-6 and if you have a 20 or 30% off card, they are even less. Most 9 & 10 year old girls would love one. You are being informed now in order to find the best deals as there are many great sales going on in our area.)

Some ideas from last year when we also had the 9 & 10 year olds are as follows: fishing poles (boys & girls both like to fish), jewelry, CD players, MP3 players, purses, Christian or Country CDs, wallets, games, sport balls and/or anything that you find that would be appropriate for ages nine & ten and that they would like.

These gifts will be taken in late October when we head down to Henderson Settlement in Frakes, Kentucky for a work camp. In past years we have filled Max & Flo McDonalds van with these gifts for the Children's Christmas. Our congregation, it's friends and families have been so generous in the past. Thank you in advance for providing the only gifts these children will receive on Christmas this year. Matthew 25:40 says "And the King will answer them, 'Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me." Surely these children are some of the least of these that Jesus is talking about and we have an opportunity to show His love.
