

January is an appropriate time to join the choir(s) - hint, hint!

January begins not only a new fiscal year, but a new emphasis in music and worship. With the Christmas celebrations still fresh in our memories, we move on to start another journey through the life of Jesus, starting with His baptism and following Him again through His teaching and healing ministry during Lent. Easter is late in 2011 (April 24), but we'll soon be starting rehearsals for the Easter cantata "His Last Days". Presentations will probably be Good Friday evening and Easter Sunday morning.

Persons who prefer short term commitments are invited to join the choir for this project. Again, we will need extras to portray some of the scenes. Get ready to volunteer to make this an instrument of evangelism which will bring people closer to Christ.

Three new mics, stands, cables and clips have been added to our equipment to get the sound across the sanctuary. These were purchased by a bequest from the Estate of Rev. Arthur and Julie Edmunds and are a welcome addition to our facilities. They were first used December 12.

In case you were wondering where the attractive, new choir gowns went, they went back to the company ---- to be rehemmed. We were stepping on them while going up steps.

As most of you know our former Youth Director, Breanne Brunner, is serving in a 1 year missionary position to help with disadvantaged youth in some of the poorest sections of London, England. Breanne is receiving a stipend each month for her work which is unfortunately not enough money to pay for her rent and food. Breanne left in such a rush that she did not have time to set up any sort

of fundraising to fill this financial gap. She has enough money to last her through January. Breanne would like to fulfill her 1 year commitment and stay until September but she needs some financial help to make this happen. She has a short fall of approximately \$600.00 per month. To help Breanne, the Youth Group will be collecting a free will offering after the service on Sunday, Jan 9 and Jan 16. In addition, some folks have shown an interest in "adopting" Breanne by sending a gift to her each month. If this is something that your heart is leading you to do, you can send the money directly to Breanne's father (who deposits it in her checking account) or

you can give your check to either Pastor David or Betsy Harmon who will forward the group of checks to Breanne's father. His address

is Mike Brunner, 204 St. Charles Way E307, York PA 17402. If you are interested in sending a card or letter to Breanne her address is 89a Brondesbury Villa, London NW6 6AG. Breanne has sent the following correspondence to keep us up to date on her activities.

This is my typical week....

Sundays I help with kids' work, under age 5 at the early service, and ages 5-11 at the later service. Then worship for myself at the evening service at 6pm.

Mondays I plan for the week with my line manager, and prep for kids' work the next Sunday. In the evenings I have Mission Year Training called Love is a Verb, concentrating on urban mission training. We tackle such issues as debt, power and powerlessness, domestic violence, gangs, drugs, and what it means to live as a Christian community.

There are so many problems that need to be dealt with to heal our society. We've been learning a lot about the difficulties of living in an urban setting, and how one small change in policy can affect so many lives.

In working with XLP I help with a number of projects including the MTV van. MTV's Pimp My Ride show has fixed up a police van, donated to XLP, with a recording studio that we take onto an estate (housing project) in the local area. The young men come to express themselves through recording songs, playing X-box, and generally hanging out. This gives us a chance to get to know them, and help with any immediate needs as well as building relationships.

Also as part of XLP I work in Agincourt Pupil Referral Unit or PRU. PRU schools take students that have been expelled from other schools and try to help them earn their GCSE's. GCSE's are the basic level of education here in the United Kingdom. Being similar to the High School Diploma, it's hard to get a job without having passed it.

Wednesday nights we have started a girls' group. This group is for girls from the community 11-13 to come and have dinner, games and a chat about life. The aim is to reach out into the community and help girls who might need a little extra support.

Fridays I help at the Food Bank in Poplar. The Food Bank is an emergency organization that gives food through vouchers for 3-4 days, and then helps people contact the proper benefits agencies to help them sort out what help they can receive from the government agencies. It is basically being a listening ear, and a hub of contact to get people connected to the proper agencies.

In between all that I am helping with children's work and youth work in the church. I'm helping to lead children's work

at the early service on Sundays. On Wednesday evenings I help with the home youth group, time for the youth of the church to get together and learn. Very similar to what I did at Mt. Zion.

The people that I'm working with are fantastic. They have very generous giving spirits, and just a heart about this church to serve the community. Holy Trinity Swiss Cottage church (HTSC) is a part of a cold weather shelter where seven churches in the area each take an evening in the week and host up to 14 homeless guests a night. They are given a warm place to sleep, hot meals evening and morning, and bus fair to the next church the following evening. There is such a great need in the city for people with open hearts to welcome the lost and forgotten. There is a need for someone to be positive and full of hope and joy at a time where many are worried about losing jobs, benefits and even homes. I want to thank you for your continued support. I ask you to give, not to me but to God and the people here in London who need our help. Above all else I covet your prayers, I can feel them from across the ocean. They are most helpful when I'm missing being home. Thank you again. Love,




