




We will be presenting an Easter

FINANCE COMMITTEE SUMMARY 2011 REPORT

All bills have been paid and the books are closed for 2011! The income for Mt Zion exceeded the expenses by \$3,571. A good thing! We were able to pay \$45,667 toward the principal of our building mortgage reducing our debt to \$287,612. A good thing! As we continue to pay down the principal, our interest payments will decrease. In 2010 our interest payments were \$21,432 and in 2011 the interest payments were \$17,857. The missions/outreach expenditures were \$42,586 which is 13.3% of the total expenditures, exceeding our minimum goal of 10%. A good thing!

Funds for the debt reduction came from many sources and everyone who led and supported these events is to be thanked. Fund Raisers (\$1,407), Ash Wednesday/Maundy Thursday/Christmas Eve services (\$2,347), Little Church for Change (\$1,431), Donations (\$11,395), Flea Market (\$2,160), Grocery Cards (\$5,942), Home Show (\$987), Sauerkraut Dinner (\$852), Dick Krieger Memorial (\$2,185), Budgeted from current income (\$7,800), Carryover from 2010 (\$9,200).

In 2011 Mt Zion was able to meet our financial obligations and objectives. We made good progress on the debt reduction which in turn reduces our interest payments allowing those funds to be utilized in other areas. It is important to remember our stewardship responsibilities into 2012. There will be parsonage repairs and renovations, the continuing need to reduce our mortgage on the church, support to our excellent staff and our missions/outreach activities.

Electronic giving is available. It makes it easy to keep our support of the ministries of Mt Zion during periods when we are away or when winter weather prevents our attending of weekly services. See any finance committee member for details.

As we begin 2012, please prayerfully consider your tithes and offerings to further God's work. If there are any questions, please ask any Finance Committee member – Jere Engelman, Bill Bowers, T Fetsko, Ann Geyer.
