Early in August, D.J. and I spent a couple days in Pittsburgh visiting our daughter, enjoying some real good food and touring the Heinz History Center.

The Heinz History Center is located in the "Strip District," which once was home to many mills and factories, including U.S. Steel, Westinghouse, ALCOA and the H.J. Heinz Company. These days Pittsburgh's strip district is home to a variety of food wholesalers, restaurants, boutiques, specialty shops, bars and nightclubs.

Our tour of the Heinz History Center led us through an exhibit featuring various innovations that claim Pittsburgh as their home: the air brake, commercial radio, aluminum, the polio vaccine and even Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood. The tour also included a brief history of Pittsburgh labor, which included a calendar marking the number of Allegheny County industrial fatalities on each day of a twelve-month span in the late 1800's. I noticed that one worker died on Christmas Eve. Several died on Christmas Day. It hung beneath a turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century sign written in at least two languages that warned workers to "look out for cars."

In Genesis, the Lord creates humanity, male and female in his image. The Bible goes on to say that the Lord planted a garden and put Adam into the garden where he could work and take care of it. When that became too lonely a life, the Bible goes on to say, the Lord created Eve to share life with him.

Work, innovation, creativity, language and choice stamp us as beings made in the image of God. Each is a gift God has given us to bless his creation, enrich each other's lives and bring joy to God's heart and ours. Think of that tired good feeling you have after a day of doing what you love to do, the satisfaction of a well crafted product, or the joy of watching children open gifts on Christmas day and you'll find yourself as close as you'll ever get to work as God meant work to be.

Work goes bad when work turns selfish: We work each other to death, work our families to pieces and reduce people to nothing but a cost of doing business. Adam and Eve turned their work bad when they chose to disobey God and harvest a fruit for nothing but their own good. From that day on, God has chosen to put us all on to the good work he made us to do.

Labor Day is more than the end of the summer. It is day to reflect, to remember and to consecrate all that results from work of our hands to bless our communities, our families and Mt. Zion Church. It is a day to celebrate the work as God's gift to us, a gift meant for the good of us all.

There is a sign-up sheet posted on the bulletin board outside the Secretary's Office. Please consider helping.






