Sharing in ministry is much the same as sharing in our families,;however, here we are all part of the family of God. May God bless each of you as we continue our walk together.



I want to thank you for all your wonderful support for my time in London with Mission Year. I have felt your love and prayers from across the ocean. Thank you for all your wonderful packages and letters, they mean so much to me, and help me to feel supported while being so far away from home. I feel really blessed to have so many friends and family at home praying for me. It's an interesting and challenging concept, sharing money, resources, and time with each other, but it's one that has blessed me. I love the church that I'm working in, and all the amazing people who have taught me so many new things. I have learned so much about leadership, teaching, and friendship since I've been in London.

With XLP I've been working in a Pupil Referral Unit (PRU). These are students that have been expelled from other schools, and they come to the PRU to finish their education. I've been co-leading the Girls' Group along with Sarah my colleague from XLP, and Michelle the safer schools officer from the area. We've done all sorts of different activities including, first-aid, self defense, drama, and cooking. We've had speakers ranging from members of the police department to ladies who are serving time in jail. Also with XLP is the MTV van project, which provides a mobile recording studio to meet young people where they are. This van comes onto the parking lot near where these young people live, and gives them the opportunity to express themselves by rapping. It gives a great space to build relationships. By being consistent and persistent by being there every week, no matter the weather or condition, we are gaining the trust of the young people we're working with.

I've also been involved in ministry at Holy Trinity Swiss Cottage Church. I've been leading Sunday school for the children under five in the first service, and helping out with the six to ten year olds in the second service. I've enjoyed learning how to do children's ministry with Matti, and taking a hands on role in leading Sunday School weekly. As if that wasn't enough, I'm also involved with the youth program at the church. Tim the new youth leader has started an initiative called Overcome that is bringing youth together from our church, the church across the road, and is open to all youth from North West London. I recently had the opportunity to speak to the youth during that event about foundations. It was a privilege to speak to young people about living a life build on the foundation of God and his word.


#### Starting Soon
